Notes and Comment

Note: The tags now being seen on boxes at the Homerville Produce Auction are voluntary "traceback" tags. Use of these tags is a recommended GAP or "Good Agricultural Practice".

Hand sanitizer is available at cost in the Homerville box room.

The monthly advisory committee meeting was held after the auction. Discussion was wide ranging but the focus was on needed improvements on lotting, tagging and placement.

We decided to implement a **three pronged approach** to reduce lotting, tagging and placement errors:

- 1) Blake Owen will correct as many tags and placement errors as possible until 7 PM and thereafter walk through every 10 minutes.
- 2) Throughout the auction, committee member Andy Yoder will make "On The Spot" education efforts with young or new growers who are making tagging, lotting, and placement errors.
- 3) Committee members and senior growers will be cruising the rows checking tags and bringing errors to the attention of Blake and Andy.
