1 & 1/9 Bushel	Blue lines minimum: 10 or more Bushel boxes Don't split like lots between pallets. Stack them high on one pallet. Can tag several sizes of peppers on a pallet to make up the 10 or more but buyer always has the option to take the entire pallet. Beans can be tagged "take 5 or more" but there must be at least 10 boxes.	Yellow Lines: 2 to 9 Bushel boxes	Single Bushel boxes go on the table. Do not put Bushels in the Peck Rows.
1 & ¾ Bu Cabbage	Blue lines minimum: 5 or more Cabbage boxes Don't split like lots between pallets. Stack them high on one pallet.	Yellow Lines: 2 to 4 Cabbage boxes	Single Cabbage boxes go on the table.
24 count Cucumber	Blue lines minimum: 10 or more 24-Count Cucumber boxes Don't split like lots between pallets. Stack them high on one pallet.	Yellow Lines: 2 to 9 of 24-Count Cucumber boxes	Single Cucumber boxes go on the table.
THE THE PART OF THE	Blue lines minimum: 15 or more ½ Bushel boxes Don't split like lots between pallets. Stack them high on one pallet.	Yellow Lines: 2-14 ½ Bushel boxes	Single ½ Bushel boxes go on the table.
Pecks	Blue lines minimum: 15 or more Pecks but only onions or soft fruit. Use pecks only for onions and soft fruit (grapes, peaches, etc)	Yellow Lines: 2-14 Pecks but only onions or soft fruit. Use pecks only for onions and soft fruit (grapes, peaches, etc)	Generally don't use pecks except for onions and soft fruit. Pecks not holding onions or soft fruit must be in peck rows.
10# 1 layer Tomato Box	Blue lines minimum: 8 or more 1 or 2 layer Tomato boxes. Tag several sizes on one pallet but buyer always can take the entire pallet. Don't split between pallets. Stack them high on one pallet.	Yellow Lines: 2-7 Tomato boxes	Single Tomato boxes go on the table.
